M a young ambitious man looking for ways to make quick money moves in with his grandma whose health is failing but with no lack of quick wit and resourcefulness. M is determined to succeed with his schemes but becomes involved in the family dynamics of close relatives who appear to be heartless in their pursuit of their goals while ignoring his grandma played by first time 78-year-old actress Usha who is wonderful! This film is an audience favorite with laughter, tenderness and tears so bring tissues.

Starring Fanny Ardant, the renowned International multi award-winning French actress who portrays Marie-France a woman in her sixties who lives alone in her upscale apartment in eastern Paris. A fascinating depiction of this true-life drama of what at first appears to be an impossible pairing of the have and have nots. A remarkably candid film with an in-depth insight into a very unusual but true story.

This documentary features Michelin starred Yoshinori Ishii and his team as they set out to transform a historic Japanese Inn now named Auberge Tokito into the premier Tokyo destination for a once in a lifetime dining experience incorporating all aspects of traditional Japanese cuisine. This artistically directed and produced film is done more in the style of a feature film. Chef Yoshinori is a true artist not only in the exquisite food he prepares but an accomplished potter and craftsman. All the bowls, plates and tableware used in the restaurant and Inn are also produced by him and his team. Yoshinori states "For me cooking and making pottery are similar. While cooking I'm looking at the ingredients, how to cut it how to cook it, the temperature, what I will put it together with. Everything is the same with pottery". Don't miss this fascinating journey with Yoshinori as he explores the origins of these ingredients. The cinematography is beautiful, and the food prepared with seductive artistry.

ICELAND • IN ENGLISH, JAPANESE, ICELANDIC DIRECTED BY BALTASAR KORMAHUR

A romantic drama film that spans decades but begins in the late 1960's when Kristofer a young Icelandic man studying at the London School of Economics shares with friends his dissatisfaction with the program and accepts their challenge to take a job as a dishwasher in a Japanese restaurant in London. Kristofer becomes adept at this and also learns to prepare Japanese food while falling in love with the chef's daughter Miko. When Kistofer returns to the restaurant from a holiday, he discovers that the chef has closed the restaurant and taken Miko with him with no forwarding address. Fifty years later Kristofer is a widower in Iceland with medical issues. His doctor advises him to take care of any unfinished business, He returns to London seeking information from one of the former employees of the Japanese restaurant. She gives him an address in Hiroshima. Will he find her? This film made the shortlist for this year's Academy Awards and has been an audience pleaser at film festivals. Wonderful!
